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PRIOR TO THE DEATH/WHEN A LOVED ONE DIES

Our pastors consider it a sacred privilege to pray with individuals and their families as they near the end of life. If time and circumstances allow, please call the church office (919-846-2212) to notify us of your situation. One of our pastors will make every effort to pray with you and your family.

In you need to reach a pastor after hours, or on the weekend, please call the After-Hours Pastoral Care Line at (919) 256-8336, and leave a message for the pastor on call.

SETTING THE DATE AND TIME FOR THE SERVICE

Our pastors are happy to help you plan a service in which we remember the one who has died and give thanks for the promise of resurrection. The Lead Pastor is the pastoral point of contact to begin planning the service. **Before you schedule the service time and date, (with a funeral home or by printing in the obituary) please confirm that date/time with the pastor who will preside over the service. This is important so as to avoid any potential conflicts.**

PLANNING THE SERVICE

An important early step in planning the service is to gather your family to meet with the pastor leading the service. This is a valuable time to share stories and favorite memories of your loved one.

If not already provided to you, try to recall your loved one's favorite scriptures and hymns. Included in this document you will find a list of hymns and scriptures appropriate for funerals and memorial services as well as a sample order of worship.

Important questions to consider, if this information was not provided to you:

What type of service do you hope to have? Some options to consider are:

- A graveside service followed by a memorial service in the Sanctuary
- A traditional funeral service in the Sanctuary, followed by burial in a cemetery
- A memorial service in the Sanctuary, where the body is not present, or only cremains are present.
- A graveside service only, where casket or cremains are buried.

As you prepare to meet with the pastor to plan the service, please bring any instructions from your loved one regarding their end-of-life planning or hopes for the service.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

During the funeral service, several passages may be shared, including an Old Testament reading, Psalm reading, New Testament and/or Gospel reading. If you happen to know passages that were important to your loved one, please include those. If you are unsure, the officiating pastor can help.

MUSIC

To sing is to pray twice, is a quote often attributed to St. Augustine. Music and song invite us into greater prayer as we celebrate the life of our loved one, and give thanks to God.

If your loved one did not indicate which hymns they would like to include in the worship service, the pastor or music director can make suggestions and help you determine if a song is appropriate for this service of worship. A guiding question to ask is, "Does this music give glory to God and witness to our hope in Jesus Christ?" If the service is to be in our Sanctuary and music is requested, the presiding pastor will work with our Music Minister to coordinate. If you would like to include secular music during the service, please discuss with the pastor. Secular music can also be played during the reception.

Soloists and/or instrumentalists are frequently included in funerals or memorial services.

Professional instrumentalists can be secured by our music director, but there will be a performance fee involved for any musicians apart from our full-time music staff. Music, in addition to congregational hymns, can certainly enhance the service of worship, but it is optional. If you have someone in mind that you would like to participate musically in the funeral service, please discuss this with the pastor.

Prelude – The pianist will provide about 10 minutes of pre-service musical selections; however if there are favorite musical pieces that you would like to include in the service, please share that

information with the pastor. The musician will use their discretion as to their knowledge of the piece.

Congregational Hymns – Congregational singing is encouraged as it gives expression to the faith we hold, and allows the gathered community to participate together in the funeral service. It is helpful to select an opening and closing hymn, if you or your loved one had particular favorites.

Many congregational hymns can also be sung as solos. Below are suggested hymns that you might consider using in the service.

OTHER DETAILS TO CONSIDER RELATED TO THE WORSHIP SERVICE

FLOWERS

The family of the deceased often provide flower arrangements for the funeral service, typically placed on the Communion Table in the Sanctuary, on a stand in the Sanctuary, and/or an arrangement in the Narthex. Flowers that are sent by others will be placed in the Narthex or Sanctuary, per your wishes.

RECEPTIONS

If you would like time to visit with guests after the funeral/memorial service, the church will provide space upstairs in Room 200, along with light snacks.

If you would like to provide additional food items, you are welcome to do so. Please let the pastor know so that adequate table space is set up.

MEMORIAL GIFTS

Memorial gifts are a special way to honor a loved one, or to leave a legacy in their name. We are happy to include memorial gift information in the funeral bulletin.

CEMETERY AND ASH GARDEN

If your loved one had not selected a place to be buried, or for ashes to be interred, you may consider the Soapstone Cemetery (located at **10301 Old Creedmoor Road**). Within the cemetery, there is an ash garden, where cremains can be spread, as well as space for a casket or cremains to be buried. If you choose to bury an urn in the cemetery, you may order a marker for the space. The marker can be ordered from any company ([Wake Monument](#) is one option) and can be up to 20x20x3 in size. There is no cost to Soapstone UMC members or their immediate family members who would like to be buried in the cemetery. HONORARIUMS

The Sanctuary and reception areas are available at no cost to church members for services held at Soapstone UMC.

There is no charge for the services of Soapstone pastors or Soapstone music director. However, if you wish to give an honorarium, a suggested amount would be between \$150 and \$250.

If you would like to invite a soloist or special musician (violinist, for instance), our music director can assist you. The fee for a soloist or special musician typically ranges from \$100-\$250, depending on the musician, and will need to be given directly to the musician on the day of the service.

SERVICES FOR NON-CHURCH MEMBERS

If the sanctuary and pastors/staff are available, we are potentially able to host funeral/memorial services for non-members. If the deceased is not a church member, the following should be remitted to Soapstone UMC on the day of the service.

Pastor: \$250

Pianist: \$150

Guest musicians: Fees vary

AV Coordinator: \$100

Sanctuary use fee: \$250

Sanctuary cleaning fee: \$100

QUESTIONS FOR THE FUNERAL HOME

Topics to discuss with the funeral home:

- Submitting obituary
- Cremation- Cremains will need to be delivered to the church 3-4 hours before the service so that they can be placed in the Sanctuary.
- If your loved one will be buried in a cemetery, ensure that the funeral home is available for the burial on the same day and around the same time as the funeral service.
- Cemetery plots (if these are needed)
- Casket/casket container (if this decision was not made by your loved one)
- Processional to cemetery (will you need to use their car services)

SUGGESTED INFORMATION NEEDED FOR OBITUARY

If you plan to include an obituary in the newspaper, on funeral home website or in the bulletin for the worship service, the below questions may be helpful. You can put as much or as little as you want in the newspaper (the cost increases based on length and photos).

IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS TO LOCATE

- **MEDICAL INFORMATION:** Physicians, healthcare providers, allergies, assistive devices; medications. If there is a Do Not Resuscitate order - where is that located?
- **ORGAN DONOR:** If so, specify.
- **CREMATION:** Is this your wish? If so, you must have a written document signed by you. There is a form provided by the Funeral Home of your choice. It can also be found [online](#) or by searching for “Cremation Authorization.”
- **FINANCIAL INFORMATION:** Lock Box at Bank (where is the key located and who is on the signature card?) Checking, Savings Accounts; Money Market Accounts; 401k accounts; IRA Accounts and Annuity; Living trust document (if desired); Deeds to Real Estate, Stocks and Bonds, Income tax returns; Home Equity Loan. You will need to provide the institutions, locations and phone numbers, along with the account numbers.
- **INSURANCE INFORMATION:** List all of Insurance Company policies, name of agency and phone number, name of insured; beneficiary; face amount of policy and policy owner of each one you own. (Health Insurance, Life Insurance, Homeowner's Insurance, Long Term Insurance & Car Insurance.) Where are these policies located?
- **LEGAL DOCUMENTS:** Last Will & Testament; Healthcare Power of Attorney; Living Will; Durable Power of Attorney; Guardianship; Trust Documents. (Name of Attorney, address and phone numbers for each where applicable.) Original signed copies are needed.
- **SOCIAL SECURITY DOCUMENTS:** Social Security Card and Annual Social Security Benefit.
- **CERTIFICATES AND LICENSES:** Birth Certificate; Marriage License; Divorce Decree if any previous marriages; Death certificate for any previous spouses.
- **DEEDS AND TITLES:** Deeds for property; vehicles, boats, campers, etc. If you own property and the deed or title is held by a lending institution - list the name and phone number of each institution.
- **DEED TO WHERE YOU HAVE A BURIAL PLACE:** Name of place and where located.
- **MILITARY DOCUMENTS:** Service Serial Number as well if the spouse was in the Military. Copy of Discharge Papers (Completed DD214 Form)
- **CREDIT CARD COMPANIES:** Name of credit card company, phone number, whose name is on the account, along with the account number
- **FIREARM INFORMATION AND PERMITS:** Where are firearms located if applicable?
- **WARRANTY INFORMATION**
- **LOGIN INFORMATION FOR COMPUTERS,** including any usernames/passwords for various accounts.
